Dog Days

11:00-11:30 | 12:30-13:00 | 14:30-15:00

Theatre Factory's giant collie, Bowie, brings his dog-walking team to Whitehaven. Keep an eye on your sandwiches though as Bowie is closely followed by some cheeky seagulls!

The Songsmiths return to travel the site with their mobile music machine, creating one-of-a-kind songs for anyone who fancies one.

1. Bamboo By NoFit State Circus 11:30–12:15 | 15:30–16:15

A powerful circus performance using nothing but bamboo and human bodies. This high-impact, high-skill show explores the tension, balance, and harmony between people and nature. With live music, comedy, and jaw-dropping acrobatics, this is a joyful and meaningful celebration of what's possible when we work together.

Community Artists

Running throughout Harbour Fest, this area highlights the wider community work and artists that Rosehill work with.

2. Mycelium Thinking All Day

Explore the secret sounds of fungi through electrodes and modulators. This experimental installation transforms electromagnetic signals from mushrooms into sound, inviting deep connection with nature.

3. Make Eat & Laugh 12.30 | 14:00 | 16:00

Create spontaneous performances using objects from Make, Eat & Laugh's trolley. Assign movements and sounds to each, then arrange them for unpredictable, often hilarious, creative results.

4. Fragments of Belonging: Whitehaven Reimagined All day

Resident artist Anne Blankson-Hemans will be painting the harbour throughout the day. Stop by to chat and watch as the harbour's story comes to life.

Please note: filming will be in progress.

5. Tent All day

Join the TENT artists for taster activities like Pebble Poetry and Pavement Art. Tent brings creativity, play, and connection into local community spaces through weekly drop-in sessions.

Through loose-parts play and process-led art activities, children and parents are encouraged to express themselves freely and imaginatively.

Regular sessions in the community take place during term time at St Peter's Community Hall, from 15:00-18:00. Light meals and snacks are provided, and all sessions are completely free.

Soundwave Music Hub

Live performances from local artists and community groups.

A specially formed brass band bringing together players aged 10 to 80+ from across the region. Expect popular favourites and timeless classics.

6. Handpicked Productions: Sekers Objects on the Road All Day

Step aboard the Everyone Here Spark Bus for a special glimpse of the Sekers Objects exhibition. Produced by Handpicked Productions, the exhibition celebrates the rich heritage of the Sekers fabric factory - a cornerstone of local industry and international couture.

Through engaging displays and interactive elements, you can connect with the legacy of the people who made Sekers a name known far beyond West Cumbria.

At our Couture Activity Station, artists Janice and Helen invite you to step into a gallery-style space inspired by the original exhibition's striking staircase installation. Surrounded by stunning couture imagery, you'll be encouraged to contribute your own creative flair.

You can also design a high-fashion outfit using printed templates and real fabric swatches. Sketch, collage or simply explore - this hands-on workshop celebrates creativity and the vibrant legacy of our textile heritage.

7. Ragtag Roadshow All Day

Ignite your imagination at Ragtag Roadshow's 'Scrappy Van'! Reuse, Create and Play having a go at wonderful crafts with incredible colourful scrap, with the Ragtag team who promote creativity, collaboration and open-ended play.

You'll also get to meet the wonderful Peggy, their beautiful Pegasus. Peggy loves nothing more than to be the centre of attention, meeting lots of new people and of course having their photograph taken!
